Dr. Middaugh conducts research on how youth use social media to express public voice and build community, youth practices as they encounter misinformation and hostility online, and educational interventions designed to help support informed, ethical and empowered civic engagement. Her research focuses on youth broadly but with special interest in the experiences of those who may be excluded or misrepresented by powerful civic institutions.


Drs. Middaugh and Norris shared their respective experiences of teaching and mentoring the second student cohort. The event was held in a hybrid modality (in person and via Zoom).

Students had the opportunity to network and connect with industry leaders, including Bioneers President Teo Grossman.











We have had multiple guest speakers that have come and explained their work from factory farming, agricultural change, and experiences through critical situations.

I have also learned and developed finer skills on research methods from our guests and the importance of history and storytelling."



"I learned how to communicate and collaborate with others in addition to supplementing my major with other curriculums into one great project allowing me to have knowledge and expertise in research and data analytics."

Survey Findings: Suggestions for Improvement

"....structure some days where work sessions are placed at the beginning of class as those are the best times for me to meet with my group in person and allow me to ask questions to our professors..."

"Continue adapting to student schedules. It is incredibly difficult to have this three semester course mixed in with other necessary classes.

"Have more fieldtrips."



"Use less lecture and more conversation."

"Class should be more than once per week given the expectation of the work we put into the program."

"Not much instruction was given on how to research. How to research should be part of the instruction process. Not everyone who entered the cohort knew how to perform research at this level."

"I think the class shrank largely due to lack of information regarding what else is needed to get the minor, as well as busier schedules for the main majors."

"I would like more direction as to where they [faculty] would like us to be in regards to our project."

"I know attendance is not mandatory, but it would be helpful if they enforced/rewarded attendance."

Survey Findings: Other Comments

"....I think I could try and dedicate more time outside of class to communicate with others in the class, and watch all of the recordings rather than play catch up with those around me."



"I enjoyed the class discussions and group projects the most. The class should definitely incorporate both."



"I could work with the professors during their office hours to ask and reflect on some feelings I have about the material."

"I would like them [faculty] to continue bringing in guest speakers."

Tina Korani, Ph.D.


